
Extended Provision Report for Lindsworth School

On Thursday 19 July 2007, Lindsworth School held a Superstars Event for all pupils on roll. The event took place throughout the school day starting at 9am and finishing at 3.15pm. An awards ceremony took place to reward participation and achievement on Friday 20 July.

Staff within the Physical Education Department compiled a series of sporting challenges designed to encourage both personal achievement and working positively in a team situation. Pupils were divided into two ability bands for each year group and this ensured that all pupils were able to challenge themselves in closely matched competition.

Events were comprised of rowing, football, basketball, athletics, gym tests and speed, agility and quickness tests. Emphasis was placed on participation for all pupils in all events and this was achieved throughout the day. Rowing consisted of individual time and distance challenges followed by team races involving four pupils rowing a set distance using only one machine. Effective communication and teamwork was used to ensure swift change of rower each thirty seconds. A gruelling but exciting way to begin the day. Football tests were popular with staff and pupils and the first test was to dribble the ball through a circuit of cones and then shoot for goal. Each pupil had thirty seconds to score as many goals as possible. Other pupils helped to collect the balls to help their competitors. A penalty shoot-out followed with each pupil taking a minimum of five penalties each. Pupils were then placed in small sided teams and played quick matches to score additional goals and points. Gym tests involved all pupils using leg press, chest press, shoulder press and pec deck machines to find out a 'one rep max' score for each test. Basketball consisted of individual timed challenges. Firstly, all pupils worked in pairs to shoot and score baskets within a time limit and then a knockout competition to find the best three shooters for each group. Athletics was keenly contested and the ability graded groups ensured that most races were evenly contested. Twenty and forty metre sprint races were followed by relay races to encourage teamwork. Longer distance races followed both in individual and team formats.

The following day, pupils were recognised for their efforts by holding an awards ceremony for the whole school. Medals and awards were presented to the first three pupils in each year group for both ability bands and further awards were given to pupils who had displayed outstanding commitment, effort and encouragement during the competition.
